About how long are students in the Title I program?

With hard work and support from the classroom teacher and Title I staff and parents they do make growth at a variety of rates. Each month the teachers will report academic progress to the Title Director or Title teacher. Students who have made adequate and accelerated progress will be discharged. Students' will only receive services as long as they exhibit the need.

How are Title I services delivered?

Students may either be supported in reading or math, in-class, out-of-class in a small group or one-to-one, depending on several factors. Instructional strategies are consistent with classroom practices and planning for that instruction is done based on student strength and weaknesses.



What is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program that assists students in grades K-8 who have difficulty in reading and/or mathematics and are working below grade level.

West Lincoln-Broadwell currently provides a schoolwide program. This means that its primary goal is to ensure that ALL students, particularly those who are low-achieving, demonstrate proficient and advanced levels of achievement on the State of Illinois's testing instrument.

What does Title I look like?

Students will receive small group or individual instruction with certified staff.

Title I instruction is **IN ADDITION** to the regular curriculum in the area of reading and/or mathematics.

Title I personnel use a variety of supplemental and remedial materials to help students achieve academic success.

Parents are considered to be an integral part of the Title I program.



Title I is NOT... Special Education!

It is a tutorial program for students that will provide an "extra" boost in their understanding of reading and/or mathematics.

How does my student qualify for Title 1?

ALL students (K-8) are eligible for Title services.

Most services are based on the classroom teacher recommendations, while some students are placed in Title I based on the Problem Solving Team decision.

Title I eligibility is primarily based on classroom performance in the areas of reading and/or mathematics.
